Following the battle, the commander of the Numidian cavalry, Maharbal urged Hannibal to seize the opportunity and march immediately on Rome. The consequences of the war should not as a result have had a major impact on the number of citizen Carthage qualified for military service. They massed their heavy infantry in a deeper formation than usual, while Hannibal used the double-envelopment tactic and surrounded his enemy, trapping the majority of the Roman army, who were then slaughtered.

Meantime, the Gallic chiefs believed Hannibal was using them as cannon fodder.
